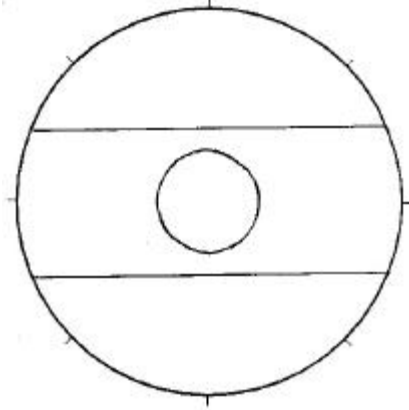


1) Ælfhelm se read(Lindenwood)

New alternate name: **Suhayb ibn Husayn ibn Sa'id ibn Ja'far**. New badge.



Vert, on a fess argent a pomme.

Documentation provided:

All documentation of given names is from *The History of al-Tabari, Volume XXXIX: Biographies of the Prophet's Companions and Their Successors*, by Abu Ja'far Muhammad bin Jarir al-Tabari (lived 839-923 CE)

Suhayb Arabic given name. "Abu hudhayfa, Salamah b. Suhayb", who lived in the 2nd half of the

7th Century CE (pg 311) also, "Abbad bin Suhayb al-Hulaybi", died around 827-828 CE (pg 324)

ibn an Arabic term, meaning 'son of'; a standard name structure. See Da'ud ibn Auda, Arabic Naming Practices and Period Names List, <http://www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/names/arabic-naming.html>.

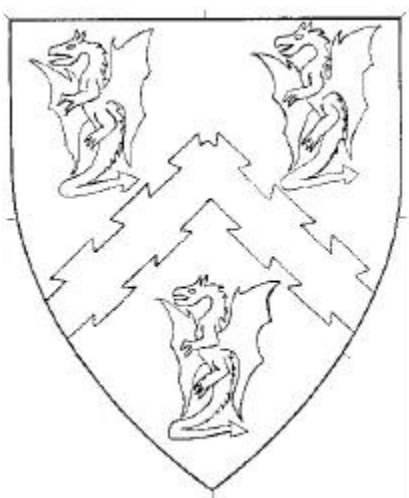

2) Ailgenan mac Aeda meic Canann (Dragonsfire Tor)

New name. New device.



Gules, a chevron dovetail countered dovetail between three dragons rampant argent.

Documentation provided:

Ailgenan Academy of Saint Gabriel Report 850 documents this spelling and construction for 9th to 12th century Irish Gaelic.

mac Aeda See above.

meic Canann See above.

Photocopies: All listed.

Changes: Any. Desired gender is male.

3) Aleysia de Eastbourne (Adlersruhe)

New name. New device.



Gules a chalice Or entwined with a serpent vert a bordure argent embattled.

Documentation provided:

Aleysia Academy of Saint Gabriel Report 1548 (dated 23 Feb. 1999) dates this spelling to the 13th century.

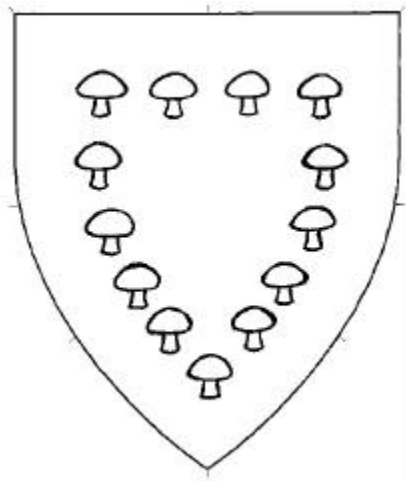
Eastbourne Ekwall, 4th Ed, Pg 156, s.n. Eastbourne, states that the name was “later Eastbourne” to differentiate from Westbourne (dated to 1305).

4) Cadhla uá Cellachán (Namron)

Resubmitted device. Name submitted in ILOI 0109.



Vert, an orle of mushrooms argent.

Previous Submission: This same device was returned for lack of a name in January 2001. Since her name is back in process, and we still have her forms in the file, we are re-activating the device at the submitter's request.

5) Charles the Grey of Mooneschadowe (Mooneschadowe)

Resubmitted name.

Documentation provided:

Charles Withycombe 3rd ed. pp 62-63, under “Charles”

Grey Reany & Wilson. p 203, under “Gray”

Mooneschadowe Group name.

Changes: Any. Desired gender is male.

Previous submission: “Charles le Grey” was returned by Laurel in LOAR 01/09 for conflict with Charles Grey, First Earl Grey.

6) Ciannait Caimbuel (Steppes)

New name.

Documentation provided:

Ciannait Woulfe, *Irish Names and Surnames*, page 209 header Ciannait gives it as the female diminutive of Cian, corresponding to masculine Cianán. Also the name of an Irish virgin saint. ÓCorráin & Maguire, *Irish Names*, page 51 header Cian gives it from ancient times, 1014, and down to modern times.

Caimbuel Black, *Surnames of Scotland*, page 129 header Campbell gives “Caimbeul” as the Gaelic form meaning “crooked mouth”.

Photocopies: None needed.

Changes: Minor only. Gaelic language/culture is most important. Desired gender is female.

7) Cunovinda ingen Choinnic (Northkeep)

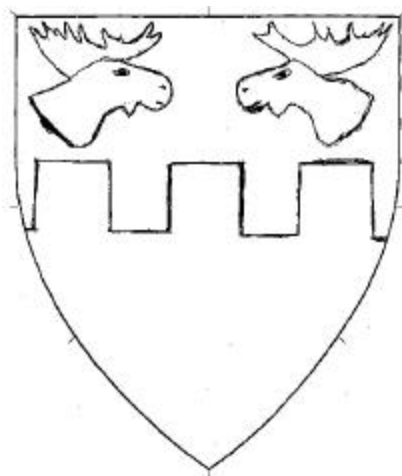
New device.



Azure, on a plate a dragon passant coward azure, within an orle argent.

8) Dafydd Whitacre (Brad Leah)

Resubmitted device.



Argent and azure embattled. Two mooseheads sable respective (or what the picture looks like).

Previous Submission: *Per fess embattled argent and azure in chief two mooseheads issuant from the sides respectant sable* was returned in kingdom May 1992 as “Not period style.”

9) Dáire de Haya (Elfsea)
Resubmitted device.



Argent, a dragon sejant affronty wings displayed gules maintaining a mullet Or and a tierce azure.

Previous Submission: Although we found no documentation of decisions for ILOI Oct./Nov. 2000, it appears that this device was returned for redraw because it was difficult to identify the dragon.

Dubh Academy of Saint Gabriel report 1267 documents this as a period Irish masculine given name.

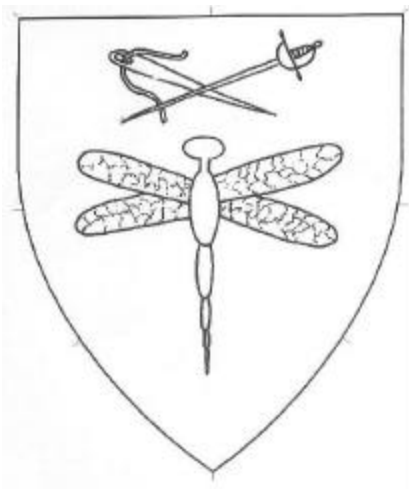
O'Ruairc Academy of Saint Gabriel report 1510 documents this as an Irish clan name.

Changes: Any. Irish language/culture is most important. Desired gender is male. Changes requested for authenticity to Irish language/culture 13th-14th century time period.

13) Faolan MacFarland (Northkeep)

New name. New device.



Azure, a dragonfly and in chief in saltire a needle and a rapier inverted argent.

Faolan ÓCorráin & Maguire, p. 92

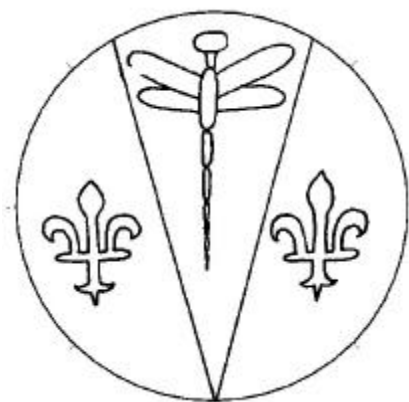
MacFarland Black, *Surnames*, p. 492, variation of "MacFarlan."

Changes: Any. Desired gender is "don't care." Changes requested for authenticity to Scottish/Irish language/culture 15th century time period.

14) Faolan MacFarland (Northkeep)

New badge.



Azure, on a pile throughout between two fleurs-de-lys argent a dragonfly azure.

15) Gerita della Mera (Glaslyn)

New name.

Documentation provided:

Gerita Italian (Venetian) feminine name. Academy of Saint Gabriel documents this as “a pet form either Margherita, Ruggera, or some similar name” on <http://www.s-gabriel.org/names/arval/venice14/venice14given.html>

della Mera “[Submitter] advised “della” is Italian for ‘of the’ and ... ‘mera was ...’sea.’”

Photocopies: All listed.

Changes: Any. 15th century Venice merchant wife language/culture is most important. Desired gender is female. Changes requested for authenticity to Venetian language/culture 15th century time period.

16) Iosbail inghean Ghilla Chriosd (Ravensfort)

New name.

Documentation provided:

All documentation is from Academy of Saint Gabriel report #2354.

Iosbail Saint Gabriel documents this name as a “best guess” for the spelling of “Issobell,” “Yssbell,” and “Isbell” in the 14th or 15th centuries.

Ghilla Saint Gabriel documents this spelling and construction.

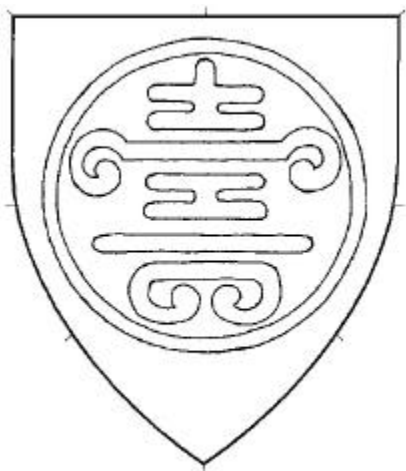
Chriosd Saint Gabriel documents this spelling and construction.

Changes: Minor only. 14th century Scottish Gaelic language/culture is most important. Desired gender is female.

17) Kusunoki Yoshikata (Blacklake)

New name. New device.



Sable, an annulet, and in annulet a pagoda argent.

Documentation provided:

Kusunoki Clan or family name of loyalists group who opposed attempt to overthrow Go-Daigo in 1331 in Komakura, Japan.

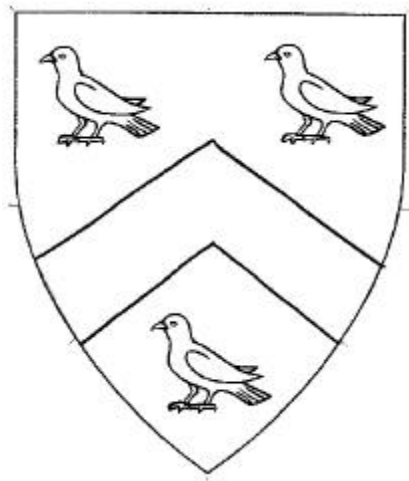
Yoshikata Surname of the uncle of Yoritomo who was the first shogun of Japan.

Changes: Minor only. Desired gender is male.

18) Líadan Arundel (Mooneschadowe)

Resubmitted name. Resubmitted device.



Argent, a chevron gules between three sparrows close proper.

Documentation provided:

Líadan Irish feminine name. ÓCorráin & Maguire p. 122 under “Líadan.”

Arundel MacLysaght p. 8 under “Arundel.” Reaney & Wilson, 3rd ed. p. 15 under “Arundale.”

Photocopies: None needed.

Changes: Any. Name “Líadan” is most important. Desired gender is female.

Previous submission: “Líadan of Sparewehavenne” was returned in September 2001 for “temporal

problems” and “mixed English-Gaelic.” Original device “Azure, between three sparrows volant natural a chevron dovetailed argent” was returned in April 1999 for violating the rule of tincture: brownish-grey birds on a blue background. New device was pended when name was returned.

19) Patric de Long Cœur (Steppes)

New name.

Documentation provided:

All documentation is from *Dictionnaire étymologique de Noms de Famille*, Marie-Terese Morlet

Patric under Pacrice p. 761, n. de bapt. Et patronyme forme savante du n. latin Praticius, (voir PARIS), forme populaire. Forme adaptée françaises: Patris, -ix, Patry, var. Irlandaise Patrick, form francisée Patric.

Long p 635, avec le art. LeLong (Nord, N.E.), c.à.d. le grand, avec une idée de minceur; form latin: Longy, form corse et niçoise: Longo, Longhi, matron.: Longe, Longue. [as a prefix] Longchambon...Lngchaux (voir CHAUX), Longuève (longue, ève, eau, étang); Longefay (longue, hêtraie)... Longval (longue vallée)... Longueserre (voir SERRE). 2. avec un sobriquet: Longavoire surnom de producteur; Loncol (long cou); Lonjarret – jaret (long jarret)

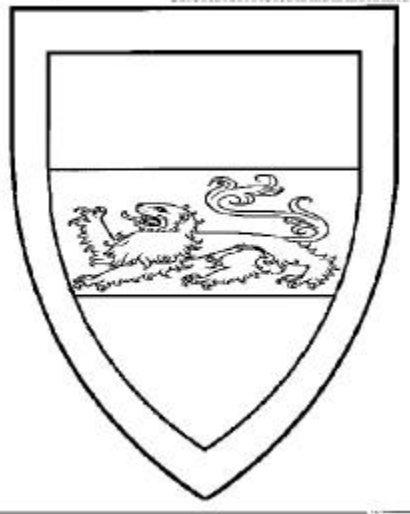

20) Richard of Durnford (Steppes)

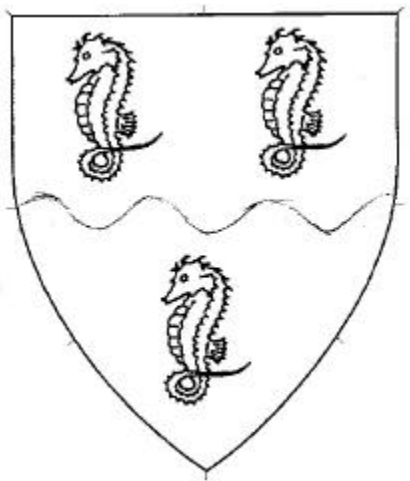

Resubmitted name. Resubmitted device.



Per fess wavy Or and vert, three natural seahorses two and one conterchanged.

All documentation is from ÓCorráin & Maguire.

Siobhan p. 165 header Sibán post 1200 spelling.

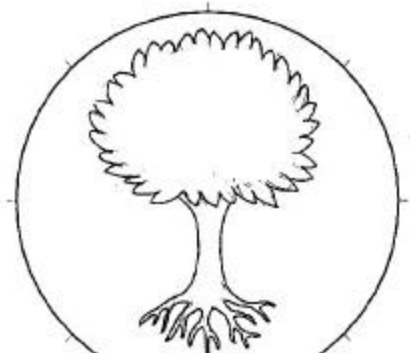
Donn p. 75 header Donn popular in later medieval period.

Neill p. 145 header Niall gives 919.

Previous submission: “Siobhán inghean uí Niall” returned in September 1999 for conflict with Siobhan O’Neill. Device was returned with name.



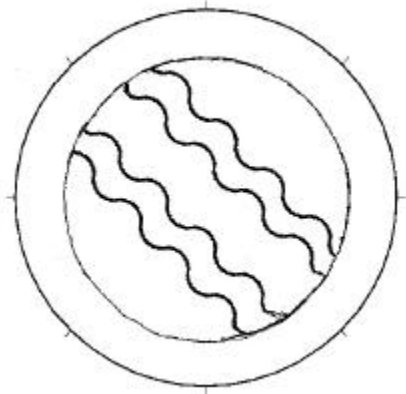
22) Siobhan inghean uí Dhomnaill (Northkeep)

Sable, a tree eradicated argent, leaved Or.

23) Stella Silvana (Elfsea)

Resubmitted badge.



Azure, two bendlets wavy within a bordure argent.

Previous submission: *Fieldless an estoile argent* was returned in February 1999 for conflict with Hieronymus Demoma.

24) Taisha Markov (Bryn Gwlad)

New name.

Documentation provided:

Taisha Wickenden, *Dictionary of Period Russian Names*, 3rd ed, p. 358; Taisha (m) – “secret,” S’t’pan Taishen, Second half of 14th century [Art VI 63; #366]

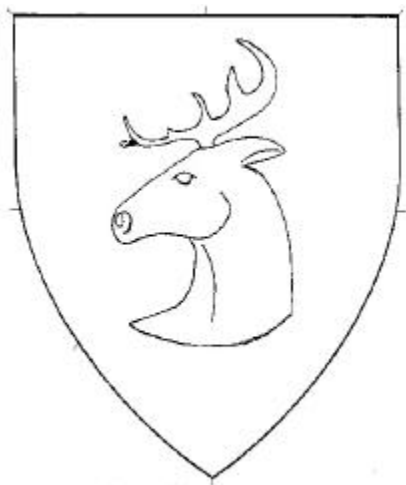
Markov Wickenden, *Dictionary of Period Russian Names*, 3rd ed, p. 202 under Mark (m) – “hammer.” Jewish Name. Not common among ethnic Russians. Marko as a Baltic variant; pats: Ivan Zhyla Markov, c1498, [PKN V 46]; Sapron

25) Thora Olafsdottir (Dragonsfire Tor)

New name. New device.



Azure, a stag's head Or.

Documentation provided:

Thora Academy of Saint Gabriel Report #2368 documents this name construction with the spelling Thóra.

Olafsdottir Academy of Saint Gabriel Report #2368 documents this name construction with the spelling Ólafsdóttir.

Photocopies: All listed.

Changes: Minor only. Sound and language/culture are most important: looking to keep Viking name with Thora as first name and last name starting with O. Desired gender is female.

27) Tómas mac Amhalgaidh (Steppes)

New name. New device.



Argent on a lion rampant queue forchee gules a thistle argent, in chief three hands gules.

Documentation provided:

Tómas ÓCorráin & Maguire, pp 171-2
 “borrowing of Biblical Thomas...This name confined to clerics in the early middle ages...It was reintroduced by the Anglo-Normans...Diminutive forms Tomag & Toimicín occur in the 14th century.

mac Amhalgaidh ÓCorráin & Maguire, p. 22 sn
 Amalgaid: Amhalgaidh. A very old Irish name common especially in Munster. In late medieval source, it is confused with Amlaib. Black, p. 455 sn
 MacCauley G. MacAmhalghaidh Iwor McAwla in

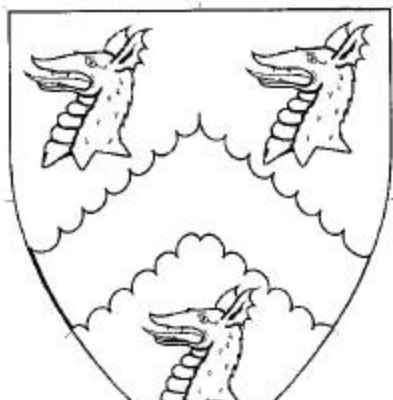

New name. New device.



Argent, a chevron engrailed between three wyvern heads erased azure.

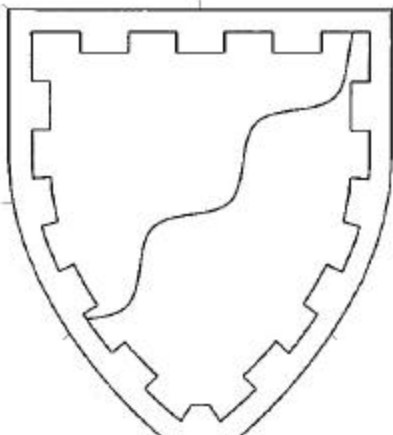

Changes: Any. Sound is most important. Desired gender is male.



29) Victor duFresne (Shadowlands)

New device.

Per bend sinister wavy, sable and purple, a bordure embattled argent.

30) Zacaria Inéz Balzan (Bryn Gwlad)
Resubmitted device.



Gules, a peacock in its pride and a bordure Or inscribed "Crux Mihi Grata Quies" gules.

Previous submission: *Gules, a peacock displayed Or* was returned in April 2000 AICC for "multiple conflicts."
