
Internal Letter of Intent 2003-10

Name accepted at Kingdom May 2003. Resubmitted Device.



Gules, a bend sinister sable fimbriated Or between a sea-lion rampant and a cross botonny Or.

Submission History: Gules, a bend sinister sable between a sea-lion rampant and a cross botonny Or was returned at Kingdom (May 2003) for violation of RfS VIII.2, Armorial Contrast and for conflict with Reynard de la Rochefoucauld: Gules, a bend sinister sable fimbriated bewteen a compass rose and a sheaf of arrows Or (Atlantia April 2004).

2) Fiona Í Fionnagaín. (Loch Ruadh)

Resubmitted Name. Resubmitted Device.



Gules, a bend sable fimbriated Or between a sea-dragon rampant and a cross botonny Or.

Submission History: Fiona Morganygg was returned at Kingdom (May 2003) for Gaelic-Welsh combination. *Gules, a bend sable between a sea-dragon rampant and a cross botonny Or* was returned at Kingdom (May 2003) for lack of name and it was noted that it violated RfS VIII.2.



Name registered April 1985 via Atenveldt. Change of Device .




Per saltire vert and sable, a Bowen knot crosswise within an orle Or.

Note: If accepted, please change old device *Per chevron sable* and vert, in cross three plates and a cobra coiled erect affronty *Or* to a badge.
