1) **Fergus d'Ornay. (Bryn Gwlad)**
New Name.

Change for: None specified.



<d'Ornay> - Dauzat & Rostaing, *Dictionnaire Étymologique des Noms de Lieux en France*, 2nd ed, p511 under the header <Ornex> gives the place name <Ornay> from 1286.

Asterisk Note: I presume I guessed correctly on the <Fergus> citation. No name was actually written down, just the Black citation, so goodness only knows what's on that page.

2) **Grainne Inghean Seadna. (Loch Ruadh)**
Name registered 2/04. New Device.



Azure, in bend a feather (or quill) argent and in chief sinister a martlet volant argent.

Asterisk Note: Name was registered as <Gráinne inghean Shéadna>, not what was written on the form. Also, the line drawing copy of the form was a B&W photocopy of the colored form. This is NOT acceptable! Because I am feeling especially nice, I have edited the scanned graphic myself. Next time I will return the item instead.

3) **Gwen uxor Dougal. (Wiesenfeuer)**
Resubmitted Name.

Submission History: Previous submission <Glynnis MacArthur> was returned by kingdom in 4/05 for lack of documentation.

4) **Phelim Gervase. (Bryn Gwlad)**


Name registered 9/97. New Badge.



Sable, a lantern between three clews Or.

5) **Stephanie Winter von Brandenburg. (Bryn Gwlad)**

New Name. New Device.



Or, in pale three crosses bottony fitchy between flaunches sable.

Asterisk Note: Photocopy of Yonge citation included. Please, please, no more! That book is listed in Appendix F "Names Sources to Be Avoided in Documentation" of the Administrative Handbook (found at www.sca.org/heraldry/laurel/admin.html). It hasn't been an acceptable source since at least 1992.

7) **Wentlyana verch Llewelyn Dineirth. (Gate's Edge)**

New Name.

Change for: Language/culture: Welsh (Gaelic) Gwynedd kingdom.

Asterisk Note: I assume the numbers refer to <Wentlyana>, <Llewelyn>, and <Dineirth> respectively, but I could be wrong. Please write out the name elements instead of numbering to avoid confusion. Printouts of the S. Gabriel report and the ENTIRE “Wales at the Time of...” website are included, along with another article not cited at all from the S. Gabriel website, as well as the cited article from the sca.org website. This resulted in a stack of paper that is (I measured) 3/8” thick – for each copy of the name form. For future reference, articles found under www.sca.org/heraldry do NOT need to be printed; other web articles only need the front page and the relevant pages included, not the entire article.
